Interim Dean for the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences (6/1/18 – 6/1/2020) Appointed by the University President to serve as the Interim Dean of the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences (BRCHS). Responsibilities include oversight for the day-to-day operations of the college to include college programming, faculty and staff hiring, purchases and budgets. In collaboration with Associate Dean and Program Chairs, complete faculty and staff evaluations, tenure and promotion decisions, compile metrics for student enrollments, solve student concerns/grade appeals and participate in student recruitment efforts.

Associate Dean of Nursing (6/1/14-7/1/18)

Appointed by the Dean of the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences. Serve as the Chief Nurse Administrator (CNA) and hold responsibility for daily operations of all nursing programs at the university. Oversight for four program directors: pre-licensure undergraduate, RN BSN, Master of Nursing (MSN), and Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP). Serve as the nursing leader and primary contact for accreditation through CCNE (Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education) to include completion of continuous improvement progress reports, self-studies, and substantive change documentation. In collaboration with the Dean, responsible for establishment and proposals for new nursing programs, budget, faculty evaluations, tenure and promotion decisions, student enrollment, admissions, and progressions, and administrative operations. Represent the University on local and state nursing leadership consortiums/committees.

Director of Undergraduate Nursing Programs (2006-2014)

Appointed to this position by the Dean of the School of Nursing. Split faculty and administrative responsibilities, specifically faculty load release time at 50% and changed to 70% after 5 years. Primary responsibilities included oversight for the day to day operations of the pre-licensure undergraduate BSN program. Primary job responsibilities included course scheduling, hiring of clinical adjunct faculty, maintaining faculty load and course assignments, support for re-entry students, compilation of metrics/analytics for student completion, attrition, and graduation rates, and directed selection process for new students. Direct supervisor and evaluator for Director of Skills Laboratory and Director of Enrollment and Program Development. Enhancements to the program included moving to a year-round curriculum model, increasing enrollment by 50%, and achieving and maintaining NCLEX-RN first time pass rates above 90%.
