2. Work in a clinical field as a speech-language pathology assistant
 - a. Assist a Master's level clinician with treatment of children and adults
 - b. Provide assistance for program development of speech-language pathology
3. Enter in an accredited Master's degree program in speech language pathology or doctorate of audiology program.

The Jacksonville University, undergraduate major in Communication, Sciences and Disorders includes courses in language development, anatomy and physiology, neuroanatomy, acoustics and phonetics and other courses for professional preparation.

Admission Requirements:

- A Standard University Application fee
- Submit CSD major application to the Director of Enrollment
- Complete 60 credit hours of college coursework
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Complete the following prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or higher prior to enrollment in upper-division CSD courses:
 - Human Anatomy & Physiology I
 - Human Anatomy & Physiology II
 - A General Chemistry or Physics course (must include a lab)
 - Human Nutrition or Human Growth & Development
 - Statistics
 - Phonetics
 - Speech and Language Development
 - Speech Anatomy & Physiology
 - Intro to Clinical Management
 - Biophysical Foundations in Health Sciences
 - Socio-cultural Foundations in Health Sciences
 - Intro to Psychology
